From The Principal's Desk

My mother is a wonderful lady and one thing she did for my brother, sister and I throughout our lives was to collect and keep personal newspaper clippings, team photos, birthday cards, school report cards etc.

Last weekend, I was perusing this collection of paraphernalia and I came across some of my primary school report cards from St Patrick's, West Bundaberg. Of particular interest was my Year 1 report written by my teacher, the rather fearsome, Sister Robert who would often make me stand in the corner of our classroom because I could not pack my cuisenaire rod box properly.

My general comment went like this: Maxwell tends to lose concentration in class quite often and will drift off. I am constantly calling his name to direct him back to his work. He finds it very difficult to sit still and has to be sat at the front of the class. Maxwell works his best during Mathematics and he is good at his tables. He has troubles making the number 3. His handwriting is untidy.

With a 'glowing' report card like this, how did I ever become a teacher?

Report cards are indeed an important part of the whole assessment 'picture' for each child at Sacred Heart.

In looking back over the past three months, we recognise that Terms 1 and 2 have witnessed significant disruptions to teaching and learning. As a result, the usual practices for academic reporting will be adjusted for Semester One to reflect the changed nature of learning over this time.

For Semester One 2020 only, our reports for Prep to Year 6 will include the following:

- The Learning Areas of Religious Education, English, Mathematics will be reported on.
- Teachers will provide a level of achievement for these Learning Areas but emphasise that the results are indicative and reflect reduced assessment information.
- There will be a written comment in each child's report.
- There is a result for personal and social behaviours.
- For children on a modified learning program, reports will be based on the learning goals specified in the Individual Learning Plan, developed at the beginning of this year.
- In keeping with advice provided by the Queensland Government and our Diocesan Catholic Education Office, attendance data will not be reported this semester.

Child's report will be made available to our families on Thursday 30th July (Week 3).

With parent / teacher interviews being held during Weeks 4 and 5 of Term 3. The manner in which these will be conducted will be finalised and communicated in Week 1 of Term 3.

On behalf of our teachers and staff, I thank you for the wonderful commitment you make to your child/ren's education, which has been especially evident over the past three months. Do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher as it is important for us to continue to work closely together to help our children progress in all aspects of their learning.

Over the past two weeks in STEAM, children have been learning Auslan. Auslan is Australian Sign Language and it is the native language of the Australian Deaf community. The language has linguistic elements, such as hand shapes (including greetings) and fingerspelling (A to Z).

Learning sign language can:

- enhance children's educational and personal development.
- increase memory retention and motion processing.
- stimulate brain development and mental flexibility.
- increase enjoyment in communicating for both hearing and deaf children.

Yesterday, I looked out of my office window as the students were heading back to class after lunch. It was fantastic to see so many engaged in conversation while walking down the path fingerspelling each other's name. When on lunchtime duties, many students have run over to greet me in Auslan and quickly signing 'See you later' as they run back to their games. I am amazed at how quickly they have remembered the few things we have learnt.
