From The Principal's Desk

For Our Year 6s - Thank you and Farewell

The Year 6s of 2020 have a unique place in the history of Sacred Heart School; they have been the leaders during one of our most unusual years.

Famously during World War 2, Prime Minister Winston Churchill gave a speech to Harrow School, his alma mater (his old school). The German U-boat offensive in the Atlantic was becoming increasingly successful, German tanks had reached the Crimea and the Blitz, catastrophic bombings of the United Kingdom, had only recently finished. Britain at the time was becoming increasingly desperate.

Churchill made the speech on 29th October 1941 to the boys at Harrow School, "This is the lesson: never give in, never give in, never, never, never, never—in nothing, great or small, large or petty—never give in except to convictions of honour and good sense. Never yield to force; never yield to the apparently overwhelming might of the enemy."

Although this year has not been quite as dramatic or as dangerous (at least in Australia) as 1941, I can see that our Year 6 leaders have shown tremendous tenacity.

Despite the cancellation of many of the events and celebrations that most Year 6s of the past have enjoyed, the 6s have had a real 'chin up' attitude. They have maturely accepted that they could not attend camp and all of the great sporting and cultural events of the past. When they have attended opportunities, they have been positive and fair participants at netball, cricket, rugby league, chess, to name a few. I have appreciated that they have not been 'whingers' and have continued to put 100% into their studies.

In particular, their confidence, patience and enthusiasm shown in our inaugural year of Peer Support, where they lead their Heart groups through a myriad of activities and discussions are to be congratulated.

They and their parents should be justifiably proud of their dedication and resilience.

Australia is well placed to be a central player in a post-Covid world. Compared to other nations, our children have managed to continue being educated with few ill health effects. It will take years for our economy, like all economies, to recover, however I can see in our young people a force to be reckoned with as they hold the positive key to our future.

I wish the Year 6s the best in their secondary school studies and look excitedly forward into the future when I hear of their successes, clearly they are young people motivated to 'never give in'.

Many thanks to our Year 6 teachers: Mrs Kenny, Mrs Evans and Mrs Seymour for the support and guidance they have given our 6s this year.

Finally, I wish everyone a wonderful holiday, a joyful and happy Christmas. To all travelling be safe and we look forward to the start of school on Wednesday 27th January, 2021. Thank you very much to all our families for your support and for entrusting us with the education of our most cherished 'possession', your children.
















Mini Vinnies Christmas Appeal
