From The Principal's Desk

Often as a teacher and a parent, I hear the lament of how social media and the rise of technological devices are destroying childhood and/or creating a negative effect on society. But like most things on this earth, nothing is truly evil, it just depends on how we use it. If the pandemic happened 10, even 5, years ago we would have had dreadful difficulties in supporting remote teaching and learning. The fact that most families had access to a computer/iPad/mobile phone and Wifi made the whole task much easier.

The extraordinarily rapid development of vaccines to counteract the pandemic has been due to modern technology and the ease of communication. Scientists have been able to share and collaborate on their discoveries, despite geography and national boundaries. I have great confidence in our future, as this new group of young people take on the leadership at our school. These are the babies who have never known a world without mobile phones or Wifi. They are good people. They are learning the 'new ways' of communicating and etiquette.

Christian meditation can be described as the focussing of 'attention beyond thought and imagination' and lead to a 'still, wakeful presence to the reality of God'. At Sacred Heart meditation is used to enhance and complement other ways of praying. It is essentially a simple practice and is ideal within the classroom setting.

Each class sets time aside for meditation at the beginning of our last session. They are guided through the steps of correct posture and relaxation as well as consciousness of breathing.

Prep children have started mediation in their classes and whilst they are being guided through this process, initially it is a hard concept to master. This week, I have been spending time in Prep K while they have been practising their meditation. Whilst I should be clearing my mind of all thoughts and 'just be', I have found it quite difficult to keep it together. Their antics as they try are quite amusing. What an extremely busy start to the school year. Whether a student or teacher, and have been at Sacred Heart for many years or new to the school community, the first couple of weeks often seem like we are finding our feet all over again. One of the major focuses that we introduced last year, and will continue this year, is our new approach to word study. At Sacred Heart, a common language is used when teaching word study. This is introduced in Prep and instilled through to Year 6. We have seen wonderful results in our children's data and will continue word study as a major focus for teaching and learning across all year levels in 2021.

This year, we do not have a textbook for Mathematics, instead we will be using iMaths online to support the teaching and learning of Mathematics in our classrooms. As part of the iMaths approach, students work through real world mathematical investigations. Students use the knowledge and skills gained through the concepts being taught, applying these to solve investigations.




