From The Principal's Desk

Several years ago, I had the privilege of attending the Anzac Day dawn service at Villers-Bretonneux in the Somme, northern France.

The recognition of the Australian sacrifice was well remembered, even today, at Villers-Bretonneux. The Germans took the town on 24th April 1918 but, that night and the next day, it was recaptured by two brigades of the First Australian Imperial Force at a cost of some 1200 Australian lives.

According to our tour guide, it was the 'worst' Anzac Day dawn service he had attended in his 15 years leading the tour. There was a bitter wind and continuous rain pelting down on us, from our arrival at the memorial at 3am until the conclusion of the service around 9am. Observing the 120 miserable Australians before him, the guide firmly told us not to complain because we were safe and headed for hot food and showers later in the day, unlike the experiences of the young men whom we were remembering that day.

After the service, we toured battlefields and war cemeteries for the next two days. The historian, accompanying us, regaled us with amazing stories of courage and desperately sad tales of loss.

As a dad, it was hard not to cry standing beside the graves of young men, the same age as my sons, who would never grow old. How broken families must have been, never being able to visit lonely graves, 1000s of kilometres from their homeland. Let alone the parents whose sons were never found.

I had the privilege of attending the dawn service in Yeppoon. Aunty Nicky Hatfield did a sincere Welcome to Country. Then Bob Blair did the main address. He spoke about our indigenous involvement in conflicts.

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people served in the Boer War (1899-1902).
- Over 1000 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people served in World War I (1914-1918) and around 70 fought at Gallipoli.
- At least 3000 Aboriginal and 850 Torres Strait Islander people served in World War II (1939-1945)
- In both World Wars, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people had the highest participation rates in the military as a
 proportion of their population in Australia
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have participated in all military conflicts since the World Wars, including in Vietnam, Irag and Afghanistan and in peacekeeping operations including in Somalia and East Timor.
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people currently represent 8.8% of the Australian Defence Force.

He spoke also with sadness about how in the Defence Forces, it was for the first time many Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders were treated as equals. Unfortunately, when returning to civilian life after the war, they suffered discrimination, prejudice and injustices in not receiving entitled support. It was a text book example of truth-telling and was greatly appreciated as this is a part of our history often untold.

Later on in the day, I was extremely proud of the 160 children and staff who attended Yeppoon's ANZAC Day march. Despite intermittent rain and winds, everyone marched respectfully and most stayed until the formal ceremony's conclusion.

Many thanks on Friday morning to our Year 6KR children as they solemnly and maturely presented our ANZAC Day assembly. Also to Mr Ron Watson from our local RSL for his address and to Ethan Todd from Year 6, for his wonderful rendition of the Last Post and Reveille.

Several of our Year 4 students have organised a book sale to raise money for our local St Vincent De Paul.


The book stall will be held at first break this Wednesday 4th May in our multi-purpose area.
