Last Friday, I attended the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority(QCAA) forum on the new Australian curriculum.

It is being refreshed to align with international benchmarks. Each Learning Area will see contemporary, refined and revised content, with changes taking place across all year levels.

What will this mean for your child at Sacred Heart?

The rollover to the new curriculum will take place over the next three years, ensuring that teachers are very familiar with the content.

QCAA are rolling the curriculum documentation out to education facilities in three phases: Familiarisation, Planning and Implementation. There will be many resources and professional development opportunities that will be available to leadership and teaching staff in our school.

In 2023, our school will begin the familiarisation and planning stage for English and Mathematics.
