From the Principal's Desk

This Monday 28th November at our End of Year Thanksgiving mass, we will be acknowledging our Year 6 children who come to the conclusion of their primary schooling on Friday 2nd December. With this is mind, I share this reflection.

In 1856, a principal at a college in Colchester, England gave his departing senior class some advice. His words have been adapted over the years and a sense of them is written below. Ironically, his name was Mr Wiseman.

His message was clear – the habits you form in life by your thoughts, words and actions eventually become 'who you are'. If you are someone who casually annoys someone often – you can become a bully. If you are someone who casually chats about someone else's business – you could become a gossip. If you are someone who looks out for others and gently checks others are okay – you can become a great friend. If you are someone who always acts with integrity, even when no one is watching – you are a person of leadership and integrity.

His advice:

"Watch your thoughts, they become words; watch your words, they become actions; watch your actions, they become habits; watch your habits, they become character; watch your character, for it becomes your destiny." Mr Wiseman (1856)

This year, we have had the privilege of educating sixty Year 6s. They as a group have achieved a lot, represented our school extremely well and hopefully thoroughly enjoyed their time at Sacred Heart.

It has been a pleasure to watch young children develop into soon to be young teens, heading on their journey to adulthood.

Yesterday, our school house captains attended our Year 1 and 2 / 3 swimming carnivals and assisted in the pool. The manner in which they cared for each swimmer, helped those who were struggling and applauded those who swam well made me extremely proud. It is these moments that make you realise it is all worthwhile.

Sacred Heart School hopes that, the foundation values and habits we have instilled in our Year 6s will lead to lives that are rich in good habits, nurturing exemplary character.

We wish you all the best as you head off on the next step in your destiny.

Today at Sacred Heart, we celebrated 'The Presentation of Mary in the Temple'.

On this day, we think about Mary as a little girl and when her parents, Joachim and Anne, took her to the temple.

Parents would bring their children to the temple to give thanks for the gift of their child and to dedicate them to God. This meant that their child was to 'put God first', acting as God would want, in the choices they made throughout their lives.

On Christmas Day 1775, Nano Nagle, and her companions, took their vows as religious women. The Congregation Nano founded became known as the Sisters of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Nano valued the message in Mary's giving of herself when she was presented in the Temple because Nano wanted to say 'Yes' to what God asked of her.



"If I could be of service in any part of the world, I would willingly do all in my power." (Nano Nagle)

When our school opened, the teachers were Presentation Sisters. They were asked by the Bishop to start Sacred Heart and show the children how to live a good Christian life.

Belonging to this Presentation family gives us values to live by.

1. Presentation people know and believe that God loves everyone, just as they are. To help us believe and remember this, we need to be people who pray.

2. Presentation people know and believe that every single person is sacred to God and because of this has great dignity.

3. Presentation people act with justice. The way we treat our Earth and all people is important and we need to be just and fair.

This Presentation Day may we be like Mary and say, "Yes" to God and live in a way that makes great things happen in our world.


Whether we are engrossed in an entertaining novel, replying to an email or simply returning a text message, reading and comprehension are fundamental skills being utilised.

Instrumental Music At Sacred Heart For 2023

Sacred Heart offers our children the opportunity to be involved in a school instrumental music program.

We are asking for expressions of interest for your child/ren to be involved and confirmation for those children already participating in the program.

Children may enrol in one instrumental music lesson during class time; a second instrumental lesson will depend on the availability of lessons before/after school and during lunch times.

Once forms have been returned to our office, our instrumental music teachers will contact you regarding further details.


A levy of \$15 for a child or \$30 per family will be charged on the Term 2 school fees account upon acceptance. This offsets all operational costs incurred by the instrumental music program.

Group lessons cost \$18 (half hour). Students need to purchase their own musical instruments.

It is important to note that acceptance into the program depends upon the availability of rooms and teacher's time. Students re-enrolling will be given first preference. In some cases, students may need to be placed upon a waiting list.

All these lessons are conducted under the supervision of the instrumental music teacher.

If you wish for your child to be involved in our instrumental program, a letter is available from our school office and needs to be returned to school by tomorrow.




