Imagine trying to get through your day without hands or feet. Not being able to walk, care for your basic needs, hug those you love. Without any medical explanation or warning, Nick Vujicic was born in 1982 in Melbourne, without arms and legs. Yet, his family was destined to cope with both the challenge and blessing of raising a son.

Throughout his childhood, Nick not only dealt with the typical challenges of school and adolescence, but he struggled with depression and loneliness. He questioned if he had a purpose in life.

Nick says that his victory over his struggles, as well as his strength and passion for life, can be credited to his faith in God. His family, friends and the many people he has encountered along the journey have also inspired him.

Nick has travelled around the world, sharing his story with millions. He is an author, musician, actor and his hobbies include fishing, painting and swimming. He is the president of the international non-profit organisation, 'Life Without Limbs' which he started at 17.



Nick says, "If God can use a man without arms and legs to be His hands and feet, then He will certainly use any willing heart." A truly, inspirational man.

Another aspect of our Year 6 leadership is the election of school and house captains which will take place this Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th February when speeches will be presented and voting involving our Year 5s and 6s will take place.

Next Tuesday marks 'Safer Internet Day 2023' with a call for everyone to Connect. Reflect. Protect.

Safer Internet Day is a global event that brings together communities, families, schools and organisations from more than 200 countries to help create safer online spaces.

This worldwide initiative is celebrating 20 years in 2023, making it a great time to reflect as well as look forward.

Teachers at Sacred Heart have been shared resources to use with their students to support online safety and learning.

Technology has evolved dramatically in the past two decades and the benefits have been huge. These developments have also exposed us to many risks with real-world impacts, making online safety awareness even more important.

Some statistics that we never want your child to be a part of:

- Almost half of children were treated in a hurtful or nasty way online in the past year.
- 26 percent of children have treated someone in a hurtful or nasty way in the past.
- 1 in 10 children have been the target of hate speech online.
- 30 percent of teens have been contacted by a stranger online.
- Many parents of 14 to 17 year olds are not aware that they have viewed potentially harmful content online.

#### 2023 Calendar

Following a review around consent forms, Capricornia School Sport are trialling a new process for 2023. Whilst meeting compliance, this will also begin the transition to a digital platform in an effort to streamline the processes from school to regional level.

The **representative school sport permission details booklet (consent form)** has all the required documentation that schools / district / regions need for students to participate in trials. The form, once completed, is to be handed in to our school to be signed by either Mr Martin or myself. The forms will then be to returned to the student, who will need to submit the paperwork at the first trial. This will then be passed on by officials through the various levels of school sport.

Rockhampton District Sport Permisson Details Booklet (consent form)

We encourage you where possible to fill the form out electronically to assist with eligibility and accuracy of the documents, however handwritten copies are acceptable.

All permission booklets need to be submitted to school no later than 2 days prior to the trial to allow time for signing and associated paperwork. Students will not be permitted to trial on the day without the completed consent forms.
