Reading this story always reminds me of report cards.

On Tuesday 20th June, your child / children will receive their Semester One report card/s, through Parent Lounge.

Your child's report is a written record of their demonstrations of learning. It represents a summary of progress based on judgements made by the class teacher from formal testing, work samples, regular consultation and observation.

This written report provides just one means of communicating your child's faith, intellectual, social, emotional and physical development at school. It is important that we as parents/carers discuss our child's report card with them.

To accommodate the developmental learning needs of young children, achievement in Prep is assessed against different six point achievement codes to those in Years 1-6. These are explained in much more detail on the report card and later in this newsletter by our APC, Mrs Lisa List.

The children's progress in regard to their social and application skills are also assessed and this is another important aspect of our children's development. This looks at how they work in class, complete classroom tasks, follow directions, accept responsibility and interact with their peers.

Parent/teacher interviews were held at the beginning of this term however if upon receiving your child's report card, our teachers are always happy for you to arrange a time to meet with them.

I thank our teachers for their time, effort and professionalism in writing their children's reports. They provide families with a comprehensive overview of each child's progress.

A reminder that there have been some changes relating to subjects and grading this semester.

Reporting is an A-E standard for Years 1 to 6, with a three-point scale for effort and attitude marks across all year levels and learning areas.

The three-point scale is Commendable, Satisfactory and Needs Improvement.

Our Prep reports have the following 5-point scale for grades:

- Becoming Aware (BA)
- Exploring (E)
- Working With (WW)
- Making Connections (MC)
- Applying (AP)

Prep

Applying (AP)	The student applies the curriculum content and demonstrates a thorough understanding of the required knowledge. The student demonstrates a high level of skill that can be transferred to new situations.
Making Connections (MC)	The student makes connections using the curriculum content and demonstrates a clear understanding of the required knowledge. The student applies a high level of skill in situations familiar to them and is beginning to transfer skills to new situations.
Working With (WW)	The student can work with the curriculum content and demonstrates an understanding of the required knowledge. The student applies skills in situations familiar to them.
Exploring (EX)	The student is exploring the curriculum content and demonstrates a basic understanding of some aspects of the required knowledge. The student can apply some skills in situations that are familiar to them.
Becoming Aware (BA)	The student is becoming aware of the curriculum content and demonstrates a limited understanding of some aspects of the required knowledge. The student is beginning to use some skills in situations that are familiar to them.

Years 1-6

A	Evidence in a student's work typically demonstrates a very high level of knowledge and understanding of the content (facts, concepts and procedures) and application of skills
В	Evidence in a student's work typically demonstrates a high level of knowledge and understanding of the content (facts, concepts and procedures) and application of skills

Other changes include, reporting for Technology being split into Digital Technology and Design Technology, and the Arts by the subjects of Music, Dance, Drama, Visual Art and Media Art for the subjects studied in a particular semester.

There will be no tuckshop available in Week One of Term 3. Thank you.


Deadly Day Out Experience
