All played with great sportsmanship, skill and controlled assertiveness. They improved immensely as the carnival progressed and I enjoyed watching their support of each other and their pride in their college.

Their achievements at the carnival made me especially proud as many of the students involved were past Sacred Heart children, 'all grown up'.

It was also so enjoyable watching many past Sacred Heart girls playing for St Ursula's and also doing their college proud.

Apart from on the sporting fields, these teenagers conducted themselves admirably. They were respectful, polite and fine ambassadors for their college and Yeppoon.

The week was of course not without its 'moments' like when the 15 boys were totally distracted from their warm up by the interested looks of several older girls. Instagram can be a nuisance.

Ultimately, it was a great few days and I returned home feeling better for getting to know many wonderful, young men.

It was once written that 'It's difficult to decide whether growing pains are something teenagers have or are.'

It must be said that we all have our moments and that the teenager you 'shake your head at' probably does many of the things we once did in our teens. We turned out alright.

## **Book Fair**




Book Fair is being held at Sacred Heart next week.
