From the Principal's Desk

As part of our Catholic faith, Mary, the mother of Jesus, is an extremely important person.

One story which often resonates with older primary children was the time young Jesus was lost from his parents' care (Luke 2:41-52).

A day after travelling back from the Passover in Jerusalem, Mary and Joseph were alarmed to find the twelve year old Jesus was not with the caravan of travellers returning home. Jerusalem's population at the time was possibly around 25,000 people but, during the Passover, may have swelled to as many as 100,000. You can imagine a frantic Mary and Joseph travelling against this tide trying to seek their missing child.

Of course, the story ends well, as after three days, they discover Jesus in the main synagogue, surrounded by learned men aghast at the wisdom of this natural born scholar. Frustrated Mary appears to scold Jesus 'Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you.' 'Why were you searching for me?' he asked. 'Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he was saying to them.'

The passage then ends 'And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart'.

To me, this is a clear recognition of the humanity of the person of Mary, a good mother struggling with the vagaries, confusions and surprises of parenting.

I'm sure many of you can relate to this story – that stomach churning terror when you realise a child is missing, even if only for ten minutes.

My wife often tells the story of seeing my three year old pass through the electronic doors on to the road, as she waited at the grocery check out in Bundaberg. If not for the common sense of a stranger, this story could be sadly more significant to us, a date and time forever etched on our memories.

I'm sure you have ached at some time contemplating the grief of the Morcombe family and the tragic loss of their son, Daniel. (Now 20 years ago.) This Friday 27th, we remember, not just Daniel, but also the legacy his family has chosen to create for him in the Day for Daniel.

The Day for Daniel is a National Day of Action to raise awareness of child safety, protection and harm prevention.

It is about educating children and adults about keeping kids safe through child safety and protection initiatives. It aims to help empower our children to 'Recognise, React and Report' if they feel something is not right.

The objectives of Day for Daniel are:

- To raise awareness about child safety and protection and to promote a safer community for children.
- To educate children regarding their personal safety and empower them to 'Recognise, React and Report'.
- To provide free safety and educational material.
- To honour the memory of Daniel Morcombe.

Day for Daniel is also an opportunity for Australians to make a statement that crimes against children are not acceptable.

Tomorrow, we invite our children to wear red socks or a red ribbon in recognition of Day for Daniel.

Last Thursday and Friday, along with members from all education sectors in our region, I attended Queensland Curriculum and Assessment authority (QCAA) professional development days for English and Mathematics Assessments, unpacking the new Version 9 curriculum.

We sifted through the new curriculum to consider how to provide the right environment for, and respond to the needs of young learners to discover, explore, play, create and express their thoughts and ideas.

Curriculum and assessment plans are developed using our school's pedagogy, as well as QCAA and the Australian Curriculum and Reporting Authority (ACARA) guidelines.

When designing assessments, it is important to keep in mind that it is an ongoing process of gathering, analysing and reflecting on evidence to make informed judgements about the achievement or capabilities of our learners.

Assessment also plays an integral role in improving learning and informing teaching. Next year, our teachers will have the opportunity to work collaboratively to refine and realign learning sequences and assessments as we implement the new curriculum for English and Mathematics.
