#### From the Principal's Desk

'Good morning, teachers, parents and my fellow Year 5 and 6 students

I stand before you as a candidate for your 2024 school and Jordan house captain.

This week, our Year 6s were involved in presenting their speeches for school and house captains for the 2024 school year. As we watched approximately 65 speeches, I thought about just how mature these young people are and how they have 'grown up' so much over the holiday break.

These 6s were in Prep when I arrived at Sacred Heart.

Their speeches displayed honesty, a sensibility, great preparation, a sense of humour and confidence, in speaking not only to one hundred and sixty of their peers but also many parents and immediate family. A daunting experience.

Our ultimate aim at Sacred Heart, Yeppoon is to nurture children who are well rounded socially, academically, physically, emotionally and very importantly spiritually. Watching our Year 6s over the two days made me proud to think that we are doing this in some way.

All who spoke came across as being very passionate about being an elected leader and obviously much thought had gone into thinking of ways they could continue to make Sacred Heart a vital learning and family community. They were following their hearts and sharing their 'big ideas'.

Over the holidays, an article speaking of just this, appeared on a news feed. It was an interview with tennis greats, Andre Agassi, 53, and Steffi Graf, 54 who I feel displayed good parenting skills. (Hopefully, some of you may have heard of them.)

They were asked if their children have taken to tennis and the answer was an emphatic no, despite their kids' extraordinary tennis bloodlines.

Asked directly whether she has ever wanted her kids to play, Graf was unequivocal. "No, not tennis ... We both believe strongly that in order for it to become your passion, you've got to find it. So we're more a guide to support them in what they find, and get them to figure out themselves and push where they want to go to. I think the way we grew up, we were really sensitive for them to learn it on their terms."

For his part, Agassi famously had a love-hate relationship with tennis after being pushed mercilessly by his father. He now says these mixed emotions were a key reason he never encouraged his children, Jaden or Jaz, to take up the sport and instead encouraged them to follow their own dreams.

"As a parent, knowing so intimately what the journey is going to look like is probably not the most ideal way to share in it with them," he says. "So that was probably the leading factor. And secondly, you know, you kind of followed their hearts and dreams, and nurtured them to make sure that their lives reflect things that they choose. So Jaz and Jade, watching them choose, and work and grow, that's kind of as simple as it gets."

Jaden Agassi is making large strides in baseball. Jaz has been a competitive hip-hop dancer.

So we wish all our Year 6s the very best for their final year of primary schooling and with foresight, thank them for their ideas, their commitment and their will to make their final year a special one.

#### **From Our APC**

This week, teachers participated in a Mathematics Professional Development afternoon, unpacking the resources available in our new Mathematics program; Maths Trek.

Maths Trek offers our teachers comprehensive lesson guides to support the teaching of concepts and higher order thinking skills, has engaging resources with interactive tools, scaffolded activities to support all students, and embedded problem-solving and critical thinking activities that are engaging.

This resource follows the gradual release model, where learning activities are modelled by the teacher, after which students and the teacher work in collaboration on activities, finishing the lesson with students working independently by applying what they have learned.

Maths Trek also offers in-depth investigations, providing valuable opportunities to immerse students in extended mathematical problems.

From devising a cafe menu to planning a round-the-world trip, students are required to apply their mathematical knowledge and critical thinking to relevant, real-world problems.



## **Daniel Morcombe Child Safety Curriculum**

The Daniel Morcombe Child Safety Curriculum will be taught in all classes in Term 1. The link to the website is (<a href="http://www.danielmorcombe.com.au/dm-child-safety-curriculum.html">http://www.danielmorcombe.com.au/dm-child-safety-curriculum.html</a>)

The Curriculum is based around three key messages: Recognise, React and Report.

The **Recognise** message encourages students to be aware of their surroundings and to recognise warning clues.

The **React** message helps students to consider choices that may keep them safe or help make them safe again as quickly as possible.

The Report message encourages students to report unsafe incidents to an adult.

Teachers use a variety of materials, including interactive whiteboard activities, worksheets and safety books, to deliver the **Recognise**, **React** and **Report** messages. Developmentally appropriate scenarios are also used to explore and discuss safety situations that children may encounter in the home, at school or in their environment.

Students are encouraged to share the resources they complete in class with their families to help keep parents/carers informed about the content being discussed and to promote discussion about safety at home.

#### **Volunteer Induction**

A volunteer induction will be held in our staffroom this Monday 5th February from 8:45am and Wednesday 7th February from 3:10pm for any parents, grandparents or carers who are wanting to assist at Sacred Heart this year.

The induction needs to be completed each year, even if you attended a session previously.
