The ashes your child received as a cross are a symbol of our imperfection. We spend the next 6 weeks, reminding ourselves of all the areas of our lives, behaviour and character, that we need to 'work on'.

It is a time, Christians famously 'gave something up' or, in more recent times 'took something up'.

Years ago, I gave up sugar in my tea during Lent; no mean feat, when you considered my tea was sweeter than soft drink – 4 (heaped) teaspoons. I now drink sugarless tea, an improvement for my long-term health hopefully. The money saved was then re-routed to the Caritas social justice charity.

During a World War 2 bombing raid, a French village lost

a beloved statue of Christ. The villagers painstakingly sifted through the rubble and managed to rebuild the statue, except for its hands. They searched and searched, but the pieces were never found. Finally, the villagers placed a plaque around the neck of the statue simply saying

I have no hands but yours.

The villagers were echoing the words of St Theresa of Avila (a 16th century Spanish saint).

Christ has no body now on Earth but yours; no hands, but yours; no feet, but yours. It is your eyes through which Christ's compassion looks out on the world.

And so it is today.

Lent can be a great time as a family to recognise the needs of others.

Sit down with your little ones to discover the beautiful generosity and sense of care of your children. You are helping to build their character, to make them aware of the needs of others, encouraging them to be future adults who become world-change-makers.

From Our APC

Throughout the year, data is collected in classrooms for all children. This information is used to direct learning and teaching. Research tells us that using collected data enables more effective evaluation of programs, resources, and interventions to facilitate success.

This week, teachers in their year level, looked at student results from spelling and mathematics data collected, to identify strengths and areas for improvement at individual, class and year level requirements. This information will support and drive the next short cycles of planning in classrooms.

Our Prep, Year 1 and 2 children are in the process of undertaking an Oral Language Assessment (OLA). This is a system-wide tool to support teachers as they assess and monitor the development of students' oral language skills. It is vital that the development of listening, speaking and interacting is monitored in ways that enable our learners to receive the support they need.

Currently, students in Years 1 to 6 are completing DRAs (Diagnostic Reading Assessments). Once completed, these are then analysed by the classroom teacher to inform and support the planning and teaching of reading strategies for individual and class learning needs.

Decodables Australia

On Tuesday, Sacred Heart hosted a Decodable Readers Australia workshop, with a total of 72 teachers from across all sectors of education attending.

Our Prep teachers were amongst those immersed in a myriad of research-based approaches to support the teaching of phonics and reading using decoding strategies.

Many new readers and resources have been purchased for use in Prep, including access to the online library and learning lounge resources to be used in the classroom and home.

In coming weeks, parents of Prep students will have information sent home regarding accessing the online resources and the sequence of phonemes and graphemes (what a letter looks like and the sound it makes) that children are learning in class.

Year 4 Writers

In our Writer's Workshop we have been exploring simple and compound sentences. This week we touched on topic sentences.

After unpacking the mentor text "Courage" written by Bernard Waber, we identified sentence structure in the text, with a focus on compound sentences and coordinating conjunctions used. We then created our own sentences answering the question 'What is courage?'

We spoke about the courage it takes for a firefighter to rescue someone trapped in a burning building, but there are many other kinds of courage too. Everyday kinds that ordinary people experience all the time, like "being the first to say sorry after an argument," or "going to bed without a nightlight." The story explores the many varied kinds of courage and celebrates the moments, big and small.
