From the Principal's Desk

Several classes at Sacred Heart have been keenly involved in a Queensland RSL initiative, 'Postcards of Honour'. Their task was to decorate and write on a postcard which will in turn be

given to someone who has served.

Above are several examples from our children. The thought and care which went into each of them displayed a genuine awareness and appreciation of our children for 'service persons' both past and present.

Many years ago now, I had the opportunity to walk the Kokoda Track with students from Marist College, Emerald. At the conclusion of our trek, we visited Bomana War Cemetery, just outside Port Moresby. This area is the largest war cemetery in the Pacific, containing nearly 4000 graves of which 3069 are known and 237 unknown Australians who fought in Papua New Guinea.





I still vividly see the headstones of young men, the same age as my two sons who ventured from their homes to protect our country, never to return, never to see their mothers, fathers, families again, buried in a foreign place.

Several of the older students noticed that I was a little emotional. Beside a grave whose inscription read, "Known Only To God", we came together, hugged and cried. A moment I will always remember.

I'm sure you will pause sometime tomorrow to consider our ANZACs, reflect on the sacrifice of others and remember that you too have a responsibility to continue telling the story to our children. We need to recognise courage and to ensure the true horrors of conflict will never be forgotten.

Everyone is encouraged to attend the ANZAC march tomorrow which commences at 9.30am, leaving from the Old Railway Station across from the Railway Hotel. We will assemble at 9am and children marching are asked to be in their normal school uniforms with their school hats. Many of our teachers and staff will also be marching with our children.

Our attendance at this march last year was overwhelming. Water bottles are encouraged. Families are then asked to collect their children after the ceremony at the cenotaph.

Our dawn service will be held at 5.30am on the Yeppoon beachfront.

Many thanks to our Year 5M children as they solemnly and maturely presented our ANZAC Day assembly on Monday. Also to Mrs Sheryl O'Connor from our local RSL for her address and the St Brendan's students, Mr Jack Ingram, Mr Corey Owens and Mrs Rawiri for their singing and musical accompaniment. They were all superb.

From Our APC

If you grew up in a household similar to the one I did, then you probably heard your parents tell you that breakfast is the most important meal of the day.

As a parent, it is easy to grab the boxes of sugary breakfast treats knowing that children will devour them before heading off to school, which may seem great at the time because we know that children can concentrate better in class if they have had breakfast.

However, new research from the Australian Research Council project, looking at the impact breakfast has on students' motivation to learn and their academic performance, shares some startling statistics that may shock you.



The research found students who ate a healthy breakfast demonstrated higher levels of motivation and achievement, this is not so surprising.

The worrying fact researchers found was that students who ate unhealthy breakfasts had the same low levels of motivation, achievements and disruptive behaviours as those who ate no breakfast at all.

This is quite a shocking fact to be faced with and most likely because eating the wrong kinds of foods does not properly fuel the mind or body for what is needed to optimally "switch on" academically.

The Kids Health Organisation tells us, that eating a healthy breakfast can:

- help kids get more fibre, calcium, and other important nutrients,
- can help kids do better in school.
- improves memory and attention, which kids need to learn, and
- students who eat breakfast score better on standardised tests.

If your child is not hungry first thing in the morning, pack a breakfast that they can eat a little later, on the bus or on the way to school. Fresh fruit, cereal, nuts, or half a peanut butter and banana sandwich are nutritious, easy to make, and easy for kids to eat on the go. Breakfast Basics, medically reviewed by Dr. Mary L. Gavin.
