Teachers have been sent resources from the eSafety Commission to support our students. Some of the content covers the following:


• Having online safety conversations

Uniform Requirements

- Children, with pierced ears, are to wear small, plain, studs. No other body piercing is acceptable.
- Hair is to be cut in an acceptable style suitable for primary school children. If hair touches the shirt collar, it must be tied back.
- Hair colouring is not acceptable. Hair is to be fastened by small plain clips, plain band or a ribbon in the school colours: plain red, blue or white.

- Socks, are to be plain white or the Sacred Heart socks.
- School shoes are to be plain black with black soles.
- Jewellery is to be avoided, however signet rings, simple crosses on small plain chains and watches may be worn.

The representative school sport permission details booklet (consent form) has the required documentation that schools/district/regions need for students to participate in trials. The form, once completed, is to be handed to our school to be signed by Mrs Kenny or Mrs Collins. The forms which need to be submitted at the trial will be returned to the student.

We encourage you where possible to fill the form out electronically to assist with the eligibility and accuracy of the documents, however, handwritten copies are acceptable.

All permission booklets need to be submitted to the school no later than 4 days prior to the trial to allow time for signing and associated paperwork. Students will not be permitted to trial on the day without the completed consent forms.

Tuckshop News

Tuckshop service has commenced this week, with Years 1-3 orders available on Wednesday and Years 4-6 available on Friday.

Orders can be made through the <u>Flexischool App</u> for both breaks. You will need to create an account and add you child as a student.

Students are permitted to purchase straight from the tuckshop at second break.

A reminder to only order from the tuckshop on your child's designated day.

Siblings are not able to order food for other siblings on opposite days (and vice versa), as helpers in the tuckshop are limited and unable to cope with a lot of extra orders on those set days. Please ensure the only day that your child is obtaining tuckshop is their allocated day.

Tuckshop ordering is not open to Prep students until Term 3.

The Use of Our School Oval After Hours

Sacred Heart families are most welcome to use our oval to train teams after school.

The guidelines for this are:

- A team representative to contact the office to make an oval booking.
- Children including siblings are supervised by an adult at these times.
- No pets on school grounds.
- Year 1/2 toilets closest to the oval are not used, as these are for the Outside School Hours Care facility, only.
